Senate Bill Number	Description
SB 1 with SA 1 & HA 1 & SA 3	Re-establishes and continues the Unemployment Insurance Appeals Board.
SB 18 with SA 1	Amends the <b>Delaware Prescription Drug Payment program (DPAP)</b> to ensure that, like the Nemours prescription benefit, the Medicare benefit will be the primary source of benefits for those who are eligible for it, but allows for Medicare participants who are otherwise eligible for DPAP assistance to cover gaps left by the Medicare program, including co-pays, premiums, and prescription costs when necessary.
SB 32	Enables the <b>Board of Podiatry</b> to issue licenses to podiatric physicians who are participating in a residency program in this state. The license is temporary in nature and valid only for the period of residency or a maximum of 2 years with one renewal. Subsection 513(e) relating to licensure while waiting to take the Podiatric Medical Licensing Examination (PMLEXIS) is eliminated as unnecessary.
SB 48 with SA 1	Requires those who are <b>authorized to write drug prescriptions</b> (podiatrists, dentists, physicians, physician's assistants, advanced practice nurses, optometrists and veterinarians) <b>to write them legibly</b> so that pharmacists filling them can do so accurately and thereby avoid potential harm to the consumers thereof. The regulatory boards of those professions would enforce these provisions just as they do other requirements of those professions.
<u>SB 60</u>	Directs the Director of the Division of Public Health to establish a sterile needle and syringe exchange pilot program in the City of Wilmington to help prevent the spread of AIDS and other diseases. The program would use a mobile health services van to offer HIV testing, health counseling, information on substance abuse treatment, and a one-to-one needle exchange program.
SB 62 with HA 2 & HA 4	<b>Increase the minimum wage</b> from \$6.15 per hour to \$6.65 per hour effective January 1, 2006, and from \$6.65 per hour to \$7.15 per hour effective January 1, 2007.
<u>SB 118</u>	Adds nieces and nephews as those who may act as alternative decision maker for an individual as it relates to consent for elective surgery.
SS1 for SB 151	Increase the number of public members on the 16 member <b>Board of Medical Practice</b> from 5 to 7, and thereby increase public participation in the Board. This bill also requires that Board members receive more information about cases that are closed without a hearing. And the bill eliminates a provision which gives the Executive Director and President of the Board the authority to close cases through counseling.

SS 1 for SB 153 with SA 1 to SS 1 for SB 153	Creates a system of intrastate mutual aid between participating political subdivisions and fire, rescue, and emergency medical service provider organizations within the State of Delaware.
SB 157 with SA 1	Creates a <b>Fetal and Infant Mortality Review (FIMR)</b> process in Delaware based on the National Fetal and Infant Mortality Review model.
<u>SB 165</u>	Amends Title 24 of the Delaware Code relating to the practice of Dentistry and Dental Hygiene. This new Section makes the <b>retention and disposition of dental records</b> consistent with the similar provisions in the Medical Practices Act which deal with patient medical records.
<u>SB 179</u>	Amends Title 24 of the Delaware Code relating to the practice of <b>Occupational Therapy</b> .
<u>SB 181</u>	Amend Title 16 of the Delaware Code relating to the <b>Delaware Health Resources Board</b> . This Act implements the recommendations for statutory changes adopted by the Joint Sunset Committee.
<u>SB 183</u>	Amend Chapter 37, Title 24 of the Delaware Code relating to Speech/Language Pathologists, Audiologists, and Hearing Aid Dispensers.
<u>SB 195</u>	Allows a designation on a Delaware driver's license or State issued ID card to warn paramedics of the presence of a pre-hospital advanced care directive.
<u>SB 206</u>	Protects active duty military, activated reservists, or members of the National Guard from having their <b>professional licenses expire during active military deployments.</b>
SB 285	Provides the Child Death, Near Death and Still Birth Commission access to certain medical and mental health records.
SB 295 with SA 1	Moves the government oversight of Managed Care Organizations (MCOs) to the Department of Insurance.
SB 297	Increases the maximum benefit under the Prescription Drug Payment Assistance Program to assist eligible individuals in the purchase of prescription drugs and the payment of certain Medicare Part D costs from \$2,500 to \$3,000.
SB 318 with SA 1	Prevents a nursing facility from transferring an individual to an acute care facility and then refusing to accept the individual back as a resident. The bill also grants the Division of Long Term Care Residents Protection (DLTCRP) the authority to revoke the certificate of a certified nursing assistant. It also gives the DLTCRP the limited authority to obtain the hospital records of a resident of a nursing facility in cases where the resident's care and treatment at the facility is under investigation or review by the DLTCRP.

SB 339	Deletes the Delaware Health Care Coalition from the <b>Delaware Health Information Network (DHIN) Board of Directors</b> and replaces it with the Secretary of the Department of Technology and Information.
SB 365	Adds reciprocity to the Chemical Dependency Professionals Subchapter under Title 24, Chapter 30. The bill also clarifies the criteria that must be met for a licensure to be in good standing for reciprocity purposes.
SB 368	Requires recommended HIV testing for women in the third trimester of pregnancy who are deemed to be at high risk for acquiring HIV.
<u>SB 385</u>	Amends Title 24 relating to the <b>Medical Practice Act</b> to make technical corrections to insert language required by the Federal Bureau of Investigation with regard to obtaining <b>criminal history checks</b> .
SB 403	Allows the Boards of accountancy, landscape architecture, architects, podiatry, chiropractic, cosmetologists, barbers and aestheticians, dental examiners, electrical examiners, medical, plumbing examiners, nursing, occupational therapy, examiners of optometry, pharmacy, physical therapists and athletic trainers, professional land surveyors, dietetics/nutrition, real estate commission, real estate appraisers, mental health and chemical dependency professionals, funeral services, veterinary medicine, psychology, geology, speech pathologists, audiologists, and hearing aid dispensers, clinical social work examiners, nursing home administrators, massage and bodywork, athletic agent examiners, and manufactured home installation to waive convictions substantially related to the professions under certain conditions. The bill also makes some technical corrections regarding SB 229 enacted by the 142 <sup>nd</sup> General Assembly.
SJR 8 with SA 1	Extends the period of time that the Division of Public Health has to promulgate <b>regulations bearing on home health agencies</b> .
SR 26	Creates a Health Service Corporation Task Force to examine Delaware's Health Service Corporation Statute and to determine if the Statute is fulfilling its original intent and is benefiting Delaware's health care consumers.

House Bill Number	Description
HB 18 with SA 1	Allows the State Fire Prevention Commission to <b>extend the suspension of an ambulance attendant or EMT's certification</b> to allow for a hearing, when that ambulance attendant or EMT was initially suspended by an Emergency Medical Services Medical Director. The Act also allows for Judicial Review of a decision by the Commission to suspend a certificate when the ambulance attendant or EMT no longer meets qualifications.
HB 33 with HA 1	Allows a <b>pharmacist to put on the drug container label the symptom or purpose for the drug</b> being prescribed, but only if a practitioner, as part of the prescription, indicates that the patient or their authorized representative so requests or consents to that information being on the label.
HB 50 with HA 1	Promotes patient safety and safe medication practices by limiting activities that require clinical and technical knowledge to a pharmacist or to a pharmacy intern or pharmacy student under the direct supervision of a pharmacist. The Bill promotes efficiency within pharmacy operations by allowing pharmacists to delegate non-clinical activities to pharmacy support personnel.
	Deletion of Section (e) modernizes the statues. Section (e) provided for the grandfathering of pharmacy assistants, who received training through pharmacy apprenticeship programs, into licensed pharmacists. These programs were common in the early 1900s and are no longer in existence today.
HB 67 with SA 1	Establishes a Volunteer License category for qualified dentist and dental hygienist who volunteer their time in non-profit dental clinics or non-profit dental services within the State which are approved by the Delaware Health Care Commission and approved by the Board of Dental Examiners.
HB 75 with HA 1	Reorganizes and revises the <b>Medical Practices Act</b> pursuant to the recommendations of the Joint Sunset Committee.
HS 2 for HB 108	Requires that all immunizations administered to children less than eight years of age or pregnant women contain no more than trace amounts of mercury because of the potential harmful effects it may have.
HB 116 with HA 1, HA1 to HA1, HA2 to HA1, HA3 to HA1, HA4 to HA1, and HA6 to HA1	Requires an individual or a commercial entity that conducts business in Delaware and that owns or licenses <b>computerized data that includes personal information</b> to notify a resident of Delaware of any breach of the security of the system immediately following the discovery of a breach in the security of personal information of the Delaware resident whose unencrypted personal information was, or is reasonably believed to have been, acquired by an unauthorized person.
HB 133 with HA 1, and HA 1 to HA 1	Expands to medical malpractice insurance carriers the existing duty to report settlements and jury verdicts of medical malpractice cases to the Insurance Department.

<u>HB 167</u>	Broadens the definitions of "abuse" and "neglect" used by Delaware's Adult Abuse Registry to include acts of abuse and neglect committed against all infirm adults, regardless of whether they are patients or residents of a licensed facility.
HB 182	Under this Bill, a primary supervisor of a Delaware State Trooper whose life has been taken in the line of duty will have the full cost of a basic individual contract of health care coverage paid for by the State of Delaware as long as that person is a primary survivor. This bill has been made retroactive to cover the family of Corporal Christopher Shea who lost his life while serving the State of Delaware.
HB 190 with SA 2	This Act, known as the <b>Personal Assistance Services Agency Act</b> , establishes a system through which minimum standards of consumer protection, abuse reporting, and service evaluation are adopted and enforced by personal assistance service agencies and the DHSS Division of Public Health. It requires that each caregiver is subjected to a criminal history record investigation and that the terms, scope, and duration of service are documented by the agency.
<u>HB 194</u>	Removes the expiration date of June 30, 2005 for the <b>Interstate Nurse Licensure Compact</b> .
<u>HB 200</u>	Eliminates the Sunset Provision of the <b>Safe Arms for Babies Act</b> passed in 2001.
HB 202 with HA 1	Establishes the <b>Delaware Healthy Mother and Infant Consortium</b> .
HB 205 with HA 1 and HA 2	The Act establishes a requirement that every hospital in the State perform <b>universal newborn and infant hearing screening</b> activities. This Act also provides that such screening shall be covered by health insurance policies issued in Delaware.
HB 215 with HA 1 and SA 1	This Act establishes a <b>Board of Professional Counselors of Mental Health,</b> Chemical Dependency Professionals, and Marriage and Family Therapists to license and regulate therapists, counselors, and similar practitioners.
HB 219 with HA 1	Creates an Occupational Health Program within the Division of Public Health to assess hazards in the workplace in Delaware.
HB 235	Extends the <b>Delaware Healthy Children Program</b> to include dental health care for children enrolled in the program.
HB 261 with HA 1	Allows the Delaware Department of Health and Social Services, the Health Care Commission, or any contractor working on behalf of these entities access to certain data for compiling statistics regarding supply and demand, and projections of licensed health care professionals. The Act also requires the subsequent report to be provided to the Division of Professional Regulation.

HB 266	Amends Title 24, Chapter 35 of the Delaware Code relating to the <b>Board of Examiners in Psychology</b> . Provides that the doctorate degree of an applicant applying for licensure through reciprocity must be in the field of Psychology as is currently required of an applicant by direct licensure.
HB 282	Makes the membership of the <b>advisory committee on ambulance service</b> better reflect the organizations providing ambulance service in Delaware.
<u>HB 299</u>	Amends Titles 1, 3, 6, 7, 10, 11, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 23, 24, 26, 29, 30, and 31. Establishes the <b>Office of Management and Budget</b> and transfers selected Divisions and other organizational units under this new Office. This bill <b>affects the Division of Professional Regulation.</b>
<u>HB 324</u>	Amends the <b>Patients' Trust Fund</b> to conform to Social Security Regulation 20 CFR Section 404.2045, and to the Cash Management Policies of the State. The Act also requires that interest earned on Patients' Trust Funds be credited monthly to the Patients' individual accounts.
HB 325	Allows the Bureau of Health Planning and Resources Management, located within the Division of Public Health, to charge fees to cover the cost incurred by the Bureau in administering the Conrad State 30/J-1 Visa Waiver Program. This Program, established by the United States Department of Health and Human Services, enables international medical graduates to practice in medically underserved areas without returning to their home country for at least two (2) years before re-entering the United States. Acting as an interested state agency, the Delaware Department of Health and Social Services may make a recommendation to the U.S. Department of State to recommend that the Immigration and Naturalization Service waive the home residence requirement for up to thirty (30) J-1 physicians annually who agree to practice for a minimum of three (3) years in an underserved area of the State of Delaware. The Program enables Delaware to place physicians in underserved areas and improve access to care. The Bureau receives no funding for staff support and other expenses necessary to administer the program. This Act will help offset those expenses.
HB 335 with HA 1	Permits the operation and/or administration of a Delaware State Veterans' Home by the Delaware Commission of Veterans' Affairs.
HS 1 for HB 412	Amends the Delaware Statute to allow open sympathetic and compassionate communication between health care providers, patients, and their families.

Number	Description
<u>HB 418</u>	Amends Title 24 to allow a practitioner to give a patient drugs without return value, but must the practitioner must label them in accordance with this section of the Code.
HB 446 with HA 1 & HA 2	Requires health insurance carriers subject to State regulation to continue coverage for adult children under a pre-existing family policy or adult and dependent coverage until those children turn 24 years of age, provided the children either live in Delaware or are full-time students.
HB 472 with HA 1 & HA 2	Stops the unfair practice of non-practicing, out-of-state Doctors of Chiropractic becoming licensed in Delaware solely for the purpose of reviewing, and often denying, the treatment given to Delaware residents. In addition, patients who wish to challenge a reviewer's decision will more likely have the opportunity to get an in-person examination in addition to the review.
HB 498 with HA 1	Requires criminal background checks for applicants seeking licensure as registered and licensed practical nurses in the State of Delaware.
HCR 14	Establishes the Delaware National Guard and Military Reservist Health Insurance Support Group to promote acceptance of the military medical insurance programs.
HCR 36	Requests that the <b>Department of Health and Social Services to apply</b> for Federal funds for promotion of awareness and prevention of cardiovascular disease in women.
HCR 45	Designating February as American Heart Awareness Month and Recognizing the Go Red for Women Movement in Delaware.
HCR 70	Establishes a Blue Ribbon Task Force to investigate and make recommendations thereto as to the feasibility of developing a C2H60 Ethanol plant and delivery system within the State of Delaware.
HR 30	Creates a Task Force to review and evaluate <b>healthcare associated infections</b> and submit its findings to the Speaker of the House by March 31, 2006.
HR 42	Establish a Task Force to review the <b>use of Ritalin by school age students</b> and submit a report to the Speaker of the House by April 30, 2006.
HR 70	Urges the Secretary of Labor to reconvene the Delaware Workers' Compensation Advisory Council.
HR 89	Establish a <b>Task Force to review service needs for adults on the autism spectrum who are not currently supported by any adult service agency</b> . The Task Force shall report its findings to the House of Representatives on or before May 31, 2007.

HR 93	Establish a <b>Task Force to study mental health issues for the citizens of the State of Delaware</b> and report its findings to the Speaker of the House of Representatives by January 16, 2007.
HR 94	Creates the Health Insurance Entities Task Force to examine Delaware's existing legislation in three areas relating to health insurance: health service corporations, health maintenance organizations, and health insurance rate regulation. The Task Force shall assess how the existing Statutes are meeting their intended purposes, and shall make recommendations to the House of Representatives by March 15, 2007 for any desirable changes to those laws.
