Delaware Healthcare Association Brian W. Frazee President & CEO The Delaware Healthcare Association, representing Delaware's hospitals, health systems, and related healthcare organizations, appreciates the opportunity to comment on House Bill 432.

Strengthening Delaware's healthcare workforce is one of DHA's top advocacy priorities for 2024. The Delaware Institute of Medical Education Research (DIMER) is critical to this goal. DIMER helps to secure slots for Delawareans at nearby medical schools, Sidney Kimmel Medical College of Thomas Jefferson University of Philadelphia, PA, and Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine (PCOM). HB 432 makes changes to the code relating to DIMER, including updating the composition of the DIMER Board. DHA supports that the DIMER Board will now include representation from each of Delaware's adult and pediatric general acute care hospitals as a result of HB 432.

Delaware's hospitals and health systems have all invested in graduate medical education programs, or residency programs, to train doctors once they finish medical school. This year alone, these programs are bringing over 200 doctors to the state to do their residencies at Delaware hospitals and health systems. Since a majority of physicians tend to practice near where they are trained, these programs help increase the supply of medical providers in our state. A strong partnership between DIMER and Delaware hospitals helps ensure more Delawareans are able to go to medical school and are then brought back to Delaware to train and practice.

Finally, we appreciate the efforts of the bill sponsors to make clear that HB 432 is not intended to prohibit a future Delaware medical school, nor is it intended to weigh in on that debate.

Thank you for the opportunity to share DHA's comments on HB 432.
