DHA represents hospitals and health care delivery systems in Delaware and advocates for policies that create an environment for enabling every Delawarean to be as healthy as they can be. HB 144 aims to address the increase in violence against health care workers by expanding the felony offense of Assault in the Second Degree to anyone that intentionally causes physical injury on any person providing health care treatment or employed by a health care provider. Assault in Second Degree currently applies to various professions, including physicians and nurses, but does not include numerous employees of a health system that come into contact with patients and families on a regular basis. These may include Activity Attendants, Medical Assistants and office staff, Nursing Assistants, Physical Therapists, Public Safety and Security Officers, Respiratory Therapists, EKG Technicians, Radiology Technologists, etc. HB 144 would ensure that all health care employees have the same protection under the law.
