RE: Support for HB 348, Extending Telemedicine Flexibility

Dear Representative Bentz,

Thank you for being the lead House sponsor on House Bill 348 to continue the flexibility provided by the State of Emergency Declaration for Delaware to allow for increased access to telemedicine services during the COVID-19 pandemic. The Delaware Healthcare Association (DHA) strongly supports this legislation.

HB 348 continues certain telemedicine provisions in the State of Emergency Declaration for the State of Delaware, and subsequent modifications, declared as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, including: suspending the requirement that patients present in-person before telemedicine services may be provided; suspending the requirement that a patient must be in Delaware at the time the telemedicine services are provided; and suspending any requirement that both audio and visual technology be used (permitting telemedicine services via non-smart phones or land line connections). This Act also requires that telemedicine services permitted under this Act receive the same insurance coverage as under existing law.

These provisions have been critical in reducing barriers and increasing access for patients to receive care through telemedicine during the COVID-19 pandemic. This flexibility has enabled patients to get the care they need from the safety of their own homes, while keeping non-emergency patients out of the emergency room during the crisis. Although Delaware is reopening, the COVID-19 pandemic is not over. Therefore, we need to continue these critical telemedicine flexibilities to ensure continued access to care for all.

DHA is pleased to support HB 348 and we urge your colleagues to join in extending these critical telehealth provisions.

Thank you again for sponsoring HB 348 and we look forward to working with you and the members of the General Assembly to advance this important legislation.
